HOW TO LEAVE BIBLICAL IMPRINTS INSTEAD OF BITTER SCARS (PART 2)

"Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." John 13:35 (NLT)

Respect everyone, and love the family of believers. Fear God, and respect the king. 1 Peter 2:17 (NLT)

- 1. Treat all people with honor and respect. Respect everyone...
- 2. Honor all authority. ... and respect the king.
- 3. Patiently, sacrificially, and intentionally love the family of <u>believers</u> above all else.

...and love the family of believers... 1 Peter 2:17 (NLT)

"Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." Mark 12:30-31 (NIV)

How do we love the family of believers?

A. Love them by living in an <u>understanding</u> way.

Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults (misunderstandings, inconsistent ideas, mistakes) because of your love. **Ephesians 4:2 (NLT)**

B. Love them by demonstrating God's <u>love</u> and then showing them God's truth.

"Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples." John 13:35 (NLT)

Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone. Colossians 4:6 (NIV)

Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom... Colossians 3:16 (NIV)

...speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ, who is the head of His body, the church. **Ephesians 4:15 (NLT)**

...live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble.

1 Peter 3:8 (NIV)

C. Love them by being patient as they grow.

Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. **Ephesians 4:2 (NIV)**

Going deeper on your own: Pastor Jay made the statement, "We must remember that we are not our *ideas*, we are *children of God* first and foremost!" Would you agree or disagree? He also said, "If our political position separates us from our brothers and sisters in Christ, then we have chosen our politics over our Lord." Would you agree or disagree?
