# The Making of "Magnificent Modern Family" Case Study 1 Corinthians

## A Magnificent Modern Family is one that:

#### Recognizes <u>"The Family"</u> is God's idea, not ours

1. Is built upon a great leader - "Jesus Christ". 1 Cor. 1:10 (NLT)

2. Is in Sync with why it Exists. 1 Cor. 1:10 (NLT)

#### 3. Is good at housekeeping.

(Spiritually, emotionally, physically and relationally)

## How does a Magnificent Modern Family keep house?

1. It addresses **brokenness**. (It does not ignore when something is wrong)

Your boasting about this is terrible. Don't you realize that this sin is like a little yeast that spreads through the whole batch of dough? Get rid of the old "yeast" by removing this wicked person from among you. Then you will be like a fresh batch of dough made without yeast, which is what you really are. Christ, our Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed for us. 1 Corinthians 5:6-7 (NLT) 2. It seeks "God's direction" regarding that which is broken.

I appeal to you, dear brothers and sisters, by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ to... be of one mind, united in thought and purpose. 1 Corinthians 1:10 (NLT)

"In the name of the Lord Jesus"... 1 Corinthians 5:4 (NLT)

We love each other with...Sincerity and truth...1 Corinthians 5:8 (NLT)

3. It corrects the brokenness in <u>love</u> with the end goal in mind...

How do I address the brokenness in my family?

- <u>Call it</u> for what it is. 1 John 1:9
- Starve it out, He says flee from it. 2 Tim 2:12, 1 Peter 2:11
- <u>Treat it</u>, Get help. Proverbs 27:17, 2 Tim. 2:22 & 2 Cor. 1:4
- **Invest in health**. Romans 12:1-2 & 2 Timothy 2:22
- <u>Remove it</u> all together (last resort). 1 Corinthians 5:5

Then...throw this man out and hand him over to Satan (to the world) so that his sinful nature will be destroyed (let the consequences fall where they may) and he himself will be saved on the day the Lord returns. 1 Corinthians 5:5 (NLT)

Going deeper on your own. This week read 1 Corinthians 5&6. Why do you think this family was allowing the inappropriate relationship to occur in their family? What pressures do you think they were feeling? What is the consequence of sexual sin? Why do you think Paul meant in 1 Cor. 6:18 &19? Do you have an issue in your family that's negatively affected your entire family? With Gods help what is one thing you could do this week to address this issue?
