The Lamb of God

The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29 (NLT)

Old Testament Scripture References:

- Genesis 22:7-8
- Exodus 12:11-13
- Exodus 29:38-42

1. Jesus is the one and only sacrifice that satisfies God's judgment.

The law of Moses was unable to save us because of the weakness of our sinful nature. So God did what the law could not do. He sent his own Son in a body like the bodies we sinners have. And in that body God declared an end to sin's control over us by giving his Son as a sacrifice for our sins. Romans 8:3 (NLT)

- Jesus has credited His righteousness to us. (Justification)

Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. Romans 5:9 (ESV)

(Jesus our Lord) who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification. Romans 4:25 (ESV)

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Romans 5:1-2 (ESV)

- **Jesus' righteousness transforms us into new creations. (Sanctification)**

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 2 Corinthians 5:17 (ESV)

2. God calls His children to holiness and graciously gives what He commands.

For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son... Romans 8:29 (ESV)

3. The Lamb of God provides us direct access to the Father.

Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Heb. 10:19-22 (ESV)

Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. Heb. 4:16 (ESV)

4. The Lamb of God moves us to worship.

Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!" And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, saying, "To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!" Revelation 5:11-13 (ESV)

Going deeper on your own: The last two weeks we have seen that through Christ, and Christ alone, our debts have been paid once and for all. We now have direct access to the Father because of the Lamb of God slain for our sins. What are the debts you are still trying to pay for by your own strength or through good works? Trust in the sufficiency of Jesus, the Lamb of God, to redeem you from the debts you are still trying to pay. Spend time daily this week offering a prayer of thanksgiving for being forgiven of all your sins and set free to live a transformed life.
